3 Change and theft. People steal to seal in a sense of short term comfort and escape from hat we fear.

Deeper social norms, its “out there”

Proverbs 22:3 The prudent sees danger and hides himself, but the simple go on and suffer for it.

4 The reward for humility and fear of the Lord is riches and honor and life.

The spiritually mature Loving others by tenderly asking penetrating questions.

Narcissism is the personality trait of egotism, vanity, conceit, or simple selfishness. Applied to a social group, The name "narcissism" was coined by Freud after Narcissus who in Greek myth was a pathologically self-absorbed young man who fell in love with his own reflection in a pool.

Matt 28:18-20 18 And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in [2] the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”

4 the deeper meaning – moralizim. Motivation, surface influence music film.

Narcissism is sometimes used to denote elitism or an indifference to the plight of others.

1 Timothy 3:6-7 He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. 7 Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil.

Revelation 2:14 But I have a few things against you: you have some there who hold the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, so that they might eat food sacrificed to idols and practice sexual immorality.

The stumbling block of superficiality! Sacrificing to the faults god of comfort? Emerging social norms and the impact on the “heavy” situation of an individual!

How do our emotions influence our motivations? Situation is heavy.

Attitudes by association?

The attractiveness gravity. We tend to gravitate toward agreeing with those we like.

How do motivation influences superficial and systematic processing?

1. (adj) superficial **concerned with or comprehending only what is apparent or**

obvious; not deep or penetrating emotionally or intellectually. *superficial similarities*"; "a superficial mind"; "his thinking was superficial and fuzzy"; "superficial knowledge"; "the superficial report didn't give the true picture"; "only superficial differences"

1. (adj) Superficial

of or pertaining to the superficialities, or surface; lying on the surface; shallow; not deep; as, a superficial color; a superficial covering; superficial measure or contents;

5 solving the dissidence of hair on a dog, in blasting off in to a new orbit.

Romans 7:7-11 What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the law, I would not have known sin. For I would not have known what it is to covet if the law had not said, “You shall not covet.” 8 But sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. For apart from the law, sin lies dead. 9 I was once alive apart from the law, but when the commandment came, sin came alive and I died. 10 The very commandment that promised life proved to be death to me. 11 For sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it killed me.

Orbit What I need to fear most is what seems normal to me.

1. (noun) orbit, celestial orbit

the (usually elliptical) path described by one celestial body in its revolution about another

"he plotted the orbit of the moon"

2. (noun) sphere, domain, area, orbit, field, arena

a particular environment or walk of life

"his social sphere is limited"; "it was a closed area of employment"; "he's out of my orbit"

3. (noun) scope, range, reach, orbit, compass, ambit

an area in which something acts or operates or has power or control: "the range of a supersonic jet"

"a piano has a greater range than the human voice"; "the ambit of municipal legislation"; "within the compass of this article"; "within the scope of an investigation"; "outside the reach of the law"; "in the political orbit of a world power"

4. (noun) orbit, electron orbit

the path of an electron around the nucleus of an atom

5. (verb) eye socket, orbit, cranial orbit, orbital cavity

the bony cavity in the skull containing the eyeball

6. (verb) orb, orbit, revolve

move in an orbit "The moon orbits around the Earth"; "The planets are orbiting the sun"; "electrons orbit the nucleus"

1 Corinthians 9:25-27 25 Every athlete exercises self-control in all things.
